

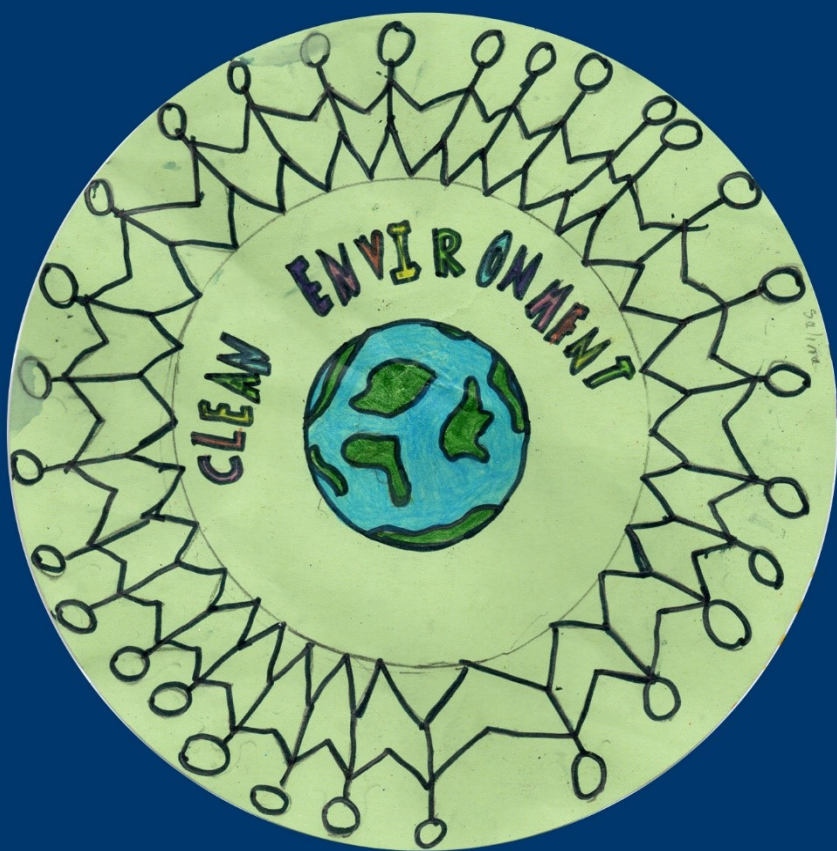

MESSAGE FROM THE HONORARY PRESIDENT



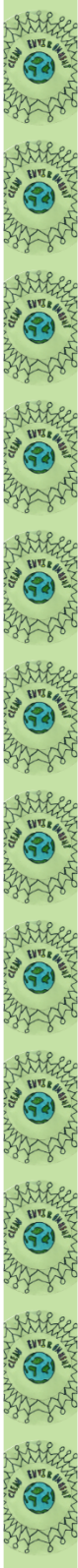

Selon le Fonds des Nations Unies pour l'enfance, depuis 2005, en moyenne 20 enfants par jour sont tués ou mutilés en raison d'un conflit. Les catastrophes naturelles sont discriminatoires et les enfants sont souvent touchés de manière disproportionnée comme le relève la Fédération internationale des sociétés de la Croix-Rouge et du Croissant-Rouge. L'Organisation mondiale de la santé estimait fin 2022 que, dans le monde, jusqu'à 1 milliard d'enfants de 2 à 17 ans ont subi des violences physiques, sexuelles, émotionnelles ou des négligences en une année. Ces chiffres et les constats de ces trois acteurs majeurs de la coopération multilatérale sont accablants.

L'engagement du Cercle féminin des Nations Unies (CFNU) pour venir en aide à l'enfance démunie dans le monde arrive en complément aux actions des Etats et des organisations internationales. MESSAGE FROM THE VICE-PRESIDENT PROJECTS



The UN Women's Guild supports programmes that support mothers and children around the world, with a focus on education, health and sanitation. The funds raised at the International Bazaar allow us to finance numerous specific, targeted projects each year, especially for those people in vulnerable circumstances. In 2022-23, funds were allocated to a total of 27 projects in Afghanistan, Argentina, Benin, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ecuador, Egypt, Guatemala, Honduras, India, Kenya, Kosovo, Morocco, Palestine, Paraguay, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Sudan and Ukraine. Specific information about each of these can be found in this brochure.

The UNWG also provides scholarships that allow secondary school students to finish their education. Through their schools, students in difficult situations are provided money to help cover school fees, uniforms, textbooks and transportation. Funds are generated primarily through the Children's Walk, which involves primary school children and their dedicated teachers from international schools in and around Geneva. Money is also raised through ad hoc donation initiatives. Currently the UNWG is supporting a multi-year scholarship programme in Sri Lanka, where students are about to sit for their A levels. We are hopeful that, with the funds raised in last two years, we will be able to open two more scholarships this year.

In addition to raising funds, the Children's Walk fosters awareness among schoolchildren living in Switzerland. These children learn about the struggles of people who may not enjoy the same educational opportunities that they do, and who face barriers to studying, such as access to books, clothes, clean water and sanitation.

Thank you for allowing the UNWG to support these life-changing projects.

AFGHANISTAN

The Independent Afghan Women's Association (IAWA) strives to provide education for Afghan children, especially girls, by building and equipping schools in impoverished areas. This project financed tables and chairs for the Secondary School Musa Shafiq so that the students no longer had to sit on the floor.



ARGENTINA

The Cultural Civil Association of Cuyo promotes cultural and social activities that complement formal education and develop awareness of personal dignity among young people. This project aimed to create space for integration, improve socialization and foster motivational creativity for girls, teenage girls and their mothers and to provide basic support and tools for single mothers, including hygiene workshops, food handling, oral health and education.



BENIN

Su'Derana est une organisation à but non lucratif fondée en 2022. Les objectifs de l'organisation sont de conduire et promouvoir des actions sur des questions de développement humain, de contribuer au renforcement du leadership féminin pour une meilleure intégration. Le projet s'est concentré sur la mise en place d'un centre de formation professionnelle en couture pour les filles déscolarisées, afin de les former à la couture et de leur enseigner des compétences entrepreneuriales de base qui les aideront à se mettre à leur propre compte après la formation.



BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Divita - Miracles was established to help the most vulnerable members of society, such as disabled children and women, improve their standard of living. This project aimed to provide prosthetic/orthotic care for disabled children, to increase their opportunity for access to education, to provide rehabilitation services, and to provide educational workshops for parents.



DRC CONGO

Les Enfants de Panzi et d'ailleurs (EPA)

est une ASBL fondée en 2015 à la suite de l'appel du Docteur Denis Mukwege, préoccupé par le devenir des enfants victimes de viols orchestrés par des miliciens. La mission est d'accompagner ces enfants vers une reconstruction et un projet de vie possible dans leur communauté, qu'ils deviennent acteurs de paix durable. Le projet vise à aider ces enfants vers une reconstruction et un futur possible au sein de leur famille et de leur communauté afin de les sortir du cycle de violence et d'en faire des acteurs de paix.



ECUADOR

Fundaciòn Henry Davis is an orphanage providing shelter for orphaned, abandoned and at-risk children, offering healthy food, age-appropriate education, and health care. For the current 48 residents, the Fundaciòn offers love and care by stimulating home environments and establishing groups under the supervision of a tutor mother. This project aimed to upgrade the rooms with new curtains and to purchase new refrigerators to properly store food.

EGYPT

Karama aims to create a new generation of artisans by raising awareness of handicrafts at risk, building capacity for existing and potential artisans and creating income-generating opportunities. The objective of this project was to teach youth with disabilities to master skills that would allow them to increase their self-esteem and give them hope for the future.



GUATEMALA

ACOE promotes training programmes to serve vulnerable groups, especially women. Through its Las Gravileas centre, it provides training to low-income women in the department of Sacatepéquez and other rural areas of Guatemala. This project supported training in the areas of professional cooking, pastry-making and bakery, with the aim of encouraging income-generating activities.



HONDURAS

Casa Alianza Honduras uses a multi-step therapeutic approach to offer all children in its care an alternative to life on the streets. The aim of the project was to make minor alterations to the main dining areas to create a proper learning space. This will allow students of the specialized staff to study after school and work together in small groups.

INDIA

Don Bosco Ashalayam travaille pour la réhabilitation des enfants des rues de Calcutta depuis plus de 35 ans. L'organisation accueille environ 300 enfants des rues et entre 2000 et 3000 enfants sont régulièrement suivis. L'objectif d'Ashalayam est de réinsérer les enfants dans la société en leur donnant les moyens de voler de leurs propres ailes. Les fonds reçus ont permis d'acheter du matériel de boulangerie qui sera utilisé pour la production de pain, de biscuits et de gâteaux pour les enfants vivant dans le centre d'accueil et pour ceux qui y viennent quotidiennement.



Projects Supported by UNWG Geneva in 2023

TAPF Switzerland provides food and supplies to poor families impacted by Covid. This project aimed to help educate adolescent girls between 12 and 14 years of age about the safe use of sanitary pads, and to distribute 2000 sanitary pad packages per month in 10 schools. This should enable the girls to continue schooling during their menstrual cycle.

Ankur – Children Home Sisters of Charity of St. Anne allows girls from the slums of Mumbai to go to school 6 days a week and live in the home, protected from exploitation and poverty. The project purchased basic furniture for support classes provided by teachers to help the girls succeed in school.



Darjeeling Children's Trust (DCT), among other activities, supports the Kripasaran Children's Home to provide a safe and healthy environment, as well as educational opportunities. The increasing importance of digital access became even more apparent during COVID lockdown. This project aimed at equipping the Home with the necessary computer equipment and other related materials for children to use.

KENYA

The Kite Oxford Nairobi project aimed at ensuring long-term, sustainable hygiene in the Nairobi Kibera slum, and in particular the Silver Springs Secondary School. As part of the project, running water and pipes were installed in the school compound and toilets were built for school students and for the wider community of the slum.



Projects Supported by UNWG Geneva in 2023

Mukuru Promotion Centre supports the Mary Immaculate Clinic to provide medical treatment in the slums of Mukuru. The minimal fees collected at the clinic cover operational costs, but there is a shortage of needed equipment. This project aimed to procure essential medical items of equipment, especially for prenatal check-ups.

Mukuru Outreach Kenya runs several programmes, including a community child centre, baby care programme, early childhood development, counselling sessions and training about gender-based violence. The aim of the project was to eliminate the need for tanker-transported water (expensive and sometimes unsafe) by providing locally sourced clean water for consumption and sanitation in the community outreach school.



KOSOVO

SBASHK - United Union of Education, Science and Culture promotes the role of education, science and culture. This project aimed to provide equipment for digital working spaces in a school in Smire village in a remote rural area. The equipment will increase the quality of teaching, engage teachers in offering better and more varied curricula, offer students more personalized and expanded learning experiences and increase engagement by both teachers and students.



MOLDOVA

AO Sezatoarea Basarabiei promotes the creation of traditional embroidered blouses, informs the public about the specific techniques and promotes the continuous study of this element of Moldovan national identity. The aim of this project is to create a small community of marginalised women in rural areas who are interested in the revival, study and promotion of the traditional blouses.

MOROCCO

Association Espoir Trait d'Union est une association à but non lucratif. Elle vise à promouvoir la culture de la réconciliation, cohésion sociale et paix. L'objectif du projet est d'entreprendre des opérations de forage de puits dans des zones rurales extrêmement sèches dans la province de Zagoura. Afin que les jeunes mères et/ou les enfants puissent se concentrer sur la scolarisation. Le projet bénéficiera à l'ensemble du village, améliorant la qualité de vie et l'hygiène des villageois ainsi que l'agriculture.

Timidi, a non-governmental organization, supports the social, economic and cultural development of the inhabitants of Tamsighate village. The village is situated in an extremely dry region with no access to running water. This project aimed to drill for drinking water and build a water tank for storage. Relieved of the task of carrying water from afar, children will be more available to attend school. Women will be able to engage in generating income, and the health of the village should improve.



PALESTINE

The **Centre Blood Bank Society** provides safe blood and blood derivatives from voluntary donations in the community to patients in hospitals in the Gaza strip. This project aimed to purchase water distillery and microscope equipment, to increase the number of distributed safe non remunerated blood units and its derivatives and to implement other blood donation campaigns.

PARAGUAY

ADEXTRA promotes social development through education and job training. The objective of this project was to organize sessions for children to improve reading comprehension and literacy skills, to promote school reintegration and to train mothers in entrepreneurship, cooking, disease prevention and basic computer skills. Funds were used to purchase didactic materials and reading comprehension games for children, LED lights for reading, kitchen utensils for training classes for mothers and two computers for training courses and teachers.

SOUTH AFRICA

SOLE Institute supports the Mitra academy, a school that gives children from all backgrounds quality education to succeed in the real world. This project aimed to enhance education by providing training and materials for Social and Emotional Learning, investing in basic laboratory equipment, expanding the collection of reading books and supplying sports equipment.



SRI LANKA

Foundation for Peace and Love provides services to families suffering from poverty, disease and disaster. The aim of this project was to create a sound foundation for child development and to offer vocational training in sewing for women. The project provided funds to purchase sewing machines for training courses, furniture and musical instruments for activities involving children and the wider community.



Sirisangabo Children's Home houses orphaned boys irrespective of their ethnicity or religion. This project aimed to improve the facilities and living conditions for the children. The funds were used to purchase new mattresses and kitchen utensils such as a rice cooker, pots and a microwave oven.



SUDAN

Shabab & Sabaya Alkher Charitable Organization serves mothers and children, with a focus on children suffering from cancer. The project allowed the establishment of a properly equipped room for children receiving chemotherapy treatment. This provides a sterile and controlled environment to prevent infection and inflammation after a dose of chemotherapy.



UKRAINE

Space of Knowledge is an NGO which aims to help establish the educational process for children and schools in need. War has destroyed two schools in this area, and the infrastructure, school equipment, technology and textbooks have been lost. Project funds will support the purchase of the most necessary items (school desks and chairs, blackboards and printer) so that the children can continue their education, at present in a temporary location.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHILDREN'S WALK COORDINATOR

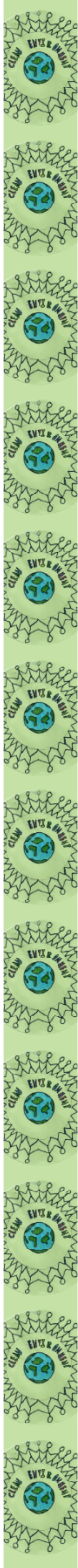
