





PROJECTS



Bosnia: Divita Miracles

Divita Miracles is a vital initiative dedicated to providing prosthetic care to landmine survivors and disabled citizens. This project aimed to reach as many individuals as possible, regardless of religion, ethnicity, location, or economic status. Through this effort, 80 to 100 women and children gained access to life-changing prosthetics, enabling them to reclaim independence and dignity. This support underscored a shared commitment to inclusive humanitarian aid and long-term recovery. Every limb fitted brought a renewed chance at education, mobility, and hope for a better future.

Brazil: Associação Nós do Crochê

Associação Nós do Crochê empowers vulnerable women through training and professional development. The project's main objective was to promote financial independence while preserving the ancestral art of manual work. Beyond economic goals, the project fostered emotional well-being by creating a nurturing community where women supported one another. The initiative also focused on psychological and social empowerment, offering a safe space where women felt valued and included. This supportive environment built self-esteem and confidence, giving participants the strength to dream, grow, and transform their lives with dignity and purpose.

Bulgaria, Sofia : "It's up to us" foundation

The Foundation "It's Up to Us", strives to inspire and mobilize people to undertake work with positive social impact. This project provided funding for a Bulgarian language programme tailored to Ukrainian refugee mothers and their children. This initiative addressed critical integration barriers by equipping mothers with essential communication skills and offering early language exposure to children during a vital stage of their development. Held at the Foundation's solidarity centre, these classes fostered community, reduced social isolation, and empowered refugee families. This support helped bridge linguistic and cultural gaps, enabling vulnerable families to rebuild their lives in a more inclusive environment.

Cameroun, Yaoundé : Groupe scolaire bilingue privé Iaïc Tiama

The **TIAMA School** was supported to establish a children's library to foster early literacy, install a hygiene facility to promote health and dignity, and create a proper dining area to improve nutrition and social interaction. These upgrades benefited 145 children and will continue to serve future students. By addressing key gaps in education and well-being, this project has helped create a safer, more nurturing environment for growth and learning.

Cameroun, Ihouck: Association des parents d'élèves et enseignants de l'école primaire d'IHOUCK

The **Ihouck primary school** in a remote village in Cameroon received support for the third phase of a rehabilitation project. With UNWG funding, ceilings were installed, electricity was connected, and a fully equipped computer room was created—including computers, a printer, projector, and a generator. These improvements benefited 120 students, 5 teachers, and 80 members of the parent association. By enhancing educational infrastructure, promoting digital literacy, and improving hygiene and safety, this project has helped provide rural children with equitable learning conditions and a more secure, motivating school environment.

Ecuador: Red Impacto Mujer Ecuador

The **Red Impacto Mujer Ecuador** received support to empower 150 vulnerable adolescent girls by enhancing their capabilities and life skills. Through targeted training, the project provided participants with hands-on experience in using essential machinery and refining their cooking and baking techniques. This initiative not only fostered vocational competencies but also opened pathways to future income-generating opportunities. By strengthening practical skills, the programme improved the girls' living conditions, built self-confidence, and promoted long-term self-reliance. This support played a vital role in transforming lives and enabling a brighter, more secure future for these young women.

Egypt: Esmaaona Foundation

The **Esmaaona Foundation** was supported to implement a project to empower women—particularly girls and widows—through periodic vocational training. The initiative aimed to reduce unemployment and alleviate poverty by providing a large number of women with qualifications in sewing and related skills. To support this, sewing machines were provided, enabling participants to begin income-generating activities immediately. This support was instrumental in helping Esmaaona secure family incomes, improve living standards, and contribute to long-term community development by creating sustainable opportunities for vulnerable women across the region.

Ghana: Agrifood Value Innovations and Marketing Society (AGRIVIMS)

The **AGRIVIMS** “Women in Beekeeping Empowerment Project” in Ghana received support to help 20 young mothers turn their beekeeping training into practical livelihoods. Many of these women, previously trained in beekeeping but lacking the resources to begin, received essential equipment through the project. With this support, they were able to generate income, care for their children, and achieve financial independence. The initiative not only empowered women but also promoted environmental sustainability by helping restore pollinator populations and plant diversity and ensuring that these skills lead to long-term benefits for families and communities.

Guinea: Association Guineenne pour la Formation et l'Insertion socio-professionnelle de Jeunes en situation défavorisée (AGFIP)

The **Guinean Association for the Training and Socio-Professional Integration of Disadvantaged Youth (AGFIP)** received support to empower young women through vocational training in the sewing trade. This initiative addressed the challenges of youth unemployment and promoted financial independence for young women in Guinea. The workshop was designed to train between 20 and 30 participants annually. As the programme evolved, it expanded in size and scope—reaching more beneficiaries and incorporating international sewing techniques and global fashion trends to improve training quality and better prepare participants for sustainable employment opportunities.

India, Ashayalam: Don Bosco Ashalayam

The **Don Bosco Ashalayam** received support to modernize its school computer lab, ensuring it met the current requirements of the Computer Science and Vocational Skills curriculum. This initiative directly benefited 150 students with disabilities by providing access to updated digital tools and an inclusive learning environment. This support helped enhance the technical skills, confidence, and future employment prospects of these students. The project reflected UNWG's commitment to inclusive education and empowerment, enabling children with disabilities to participate fully in the digital and vocational world.

India, Tamil Nadu: The Clarke School for the Deaf

The **Clarke School for the Deaf**, received support to modernize its computer lab and align it with current Computer Science and Vocational Skills curricula. This upgrade benefited 150 children and youths with disabilities by providing access to digital literacy training and certified courses, enhancing their educational and employment prospects. The project also included awareness workshops, job fairs, and collaboration with industry partners to promote inclusive employment. This initiative has helped create a more accessible, skill-based learning environment that empowered students with disabilities toward sustainable livelihoods.

India, Uttar Pradesh: Enfants des Etoiles ou Taaro ke Bacche

The “**Enfants des Etoiles – Taaro ke Bacche**” project, serves children and youth with autism and Down syndrome. This project contributed to enhancing the school's neuro-sensory integration space by providing essential therapeutic equipment and installing air conditioning to ensure a safe and functional environment. This support also enabled individualized sessions that developed cognitive and sensory skills critical for learning. This project has helped to improve educational and therapeutic access for 76 children while promoting inclusion and early intervention in underserved communities.

Kenya, Mukuru Promotion Center

The Mukuru Promotion Center is a charitable organization working with disadvantaged communities in informal settlements in Nairobi, Kenya. Support was provided to empower 80 to 150 young girls through vocational training programs. This initiative strengthened the center's capacity by enhancing learning materials, upgrading equipment, and introducing structured mentorship programs. By equipping the girls with practical skills and guidance, the project improved their confidence, employability, and long-term economic independence. This project played a vital role in creating a safe and empowering environment where young women from underserved communities accessed quality training and built a brighter future for themselves and their families.

Moldova: The Moldova Project

The Moldova Project's "Mobile Solutions for Family Empowerment" initiative, served 120 vulnerable families across rural Moldova. The project provided holistic support through mobile teams that delivered psychological counselling, educational resources, healthcare access, and art/play therapy for children. It targeted single-parent households and families facing generational poverty, social exclusion, and limited opportunities. This project helped sustain mobile operations and enhance outreach, ensuring individualized interventions and stronger community engagement. This initiative empowered families to become self-sufficient, fostering long-term resilience and social inclusion across more than 40 underserved villages in Moldova.

Mongolia: Demjleg Amjilt Sain Hun

The Demjleg Amjilt Sain Hun was supported to create a safer and more nurturing environment for children attending daycares in Khalium Sum and Olonbulag Bag, in Mongolia's Gobi Altai Province. This project focused on improving three classrooms by installing hardwood flooring, making the learning spaces cleaner, warmer, and more suitable for young children. A total of 75 children benefited from this enhancement, which supported their health, comfort, and early development. This initiative has contributed to safer educational settings and improved well-being for children in remote, underserved communities.

Morocco: Association Ghait D'autisme

The Association Ghait d'Autisme received support to establish a sensory room at the Centre Riaya in Temara. This dedicated space helped children with autism regulate sensory input, reduce anxiety, and improve emotional and social development. Designed to provide a calming and stimulating environment, the sensory room enhanced therapy sessions and learning outcomes for the children. The project also strengthened the center's capacity to deliver innovative, data-driven care, making it a model for inclusive, child-focused therapeutic interventions in the region. Around 30 children directly benefited from the project.

Morocco: Assosiation Espoir Trait d'Union Reconnue d'Utilite Publique

The “**Association Espoir Trait d'Union Reconnue d'Utilité Publique**” received support to empower women with limited resources by providing training in sewing and tailoring, equipping participants with practical skills and awarding a certificate upon completion of the training. Each woman also received a sewing machine, enabling her to work from home and generate income. By fostering financial independence and self-reliance, this initiative not only uplifted individual women but also strengthened families and communities through skill-building and sustainable economic empowerment.

Nigeria: Nigerian Association for Women's Advancement

The Nigerian Association for Women's Advancement (NAWA) was supported to enhance vocational training for young women at the Lagoon Institute for Hospitality Studies in Lagos, Nigeria. The project involved purchasing modern bakery equipment to strengthen hands-on training and expand income-generating activities. Around 100 vulnerable women aged 16–24 gained employable skills in baking, increasing their chances of securing jobs or starting small businesses. UNWG's support also helped the Institute produce and sell baked goods, enabling it to subsidize student fees and move toward financial sustainability while empowering young women to break the cycle of poverty.

Romania: ALUZIVA Association

The **ALUZIVA Association** received support to create a dedicated library space aimed at fostering a love for reading and enhancing digital literacy among children. This project benefited 232 children by providing access to age-appropriate books, educational resources, and digital tools in a safe and inspiring environment. By promoting both traditional and digital learning, the initiative supported the development of critical thinking, creativity, and future-ready skills. This support was instrumental in expanding educational opportunities and reducing learning disparities for children in underserved communities.

Sri Lanka, Vajira : Vajira Sri Children's Development Center

The **Vajira Sri Children's Development Center in Pitakotte**, received support to install solar panels and reduce the facility's high electricity costs. The center, home to 54 children from disadvantaged backgrounds, provided education, shelter, and vocational training. The solar panel system installed through this project enabled the centre to redirect savings from energy bills toward essentials such as food, educational materials, and extracurricular activities. This sustainable solution not only enhanced the children's quality of life but also supported renewable energy goals, promoting environmental responsibility and long-term operational resilience.

Sri Lanka, Pilyandale: Foundation for Peace and Love

The **Foundation for Peace and Love in Piliyandala**, received support to install solar power at its Special Needs Children's School. Due to the rising cost of electricity, the school had struggled to cover its monthly utility bills, threatening the stability of its operations. The installation of solar panels has ensured an uninterrupted power supply, providing a reliable and sustainable energy source. This initiative enhanced the learning environment for children with special needs while also reducing operational costs, allowing more resources to be directed toward education and care.

Trinidad and Tobago: Golden Hands (Steelpan Conservatory)

The **Golden Hands Steelpan Conservatory**, with the support received, implemented the “Music Is Life – Food and Music Workshop.” This initiative targeted disadvantaged children, offering them hands-on exposure to music as a transformative and empowering tool. The project aligned with Golden Hands’ mission to expand access to music education and the “Do Something Good Foundation’s” aim to support vulnerable families. By combining musical instruction with nutritional support and educational materials, the workshop promoted creativity, discipline, and well-being—providing a holistic experience that fostered both personal growth and community upliftment.

Turkiye: Gölcük Village Relief and Solidarity Association

The **Gölcük Village Relief and Solidarity** Association was able to launch the “Hands That Create” project in Seferihisar, Turkiye with the support received. This initiative aimed to empower at least 30 rural women by equipping them with essential tools—sewing, dough-kneading, and tomato paste machines—for income-generating activities rooted in traditional skills. This project helped revive local crafts, boost women’s production capacity, and strengthen household incomes. By fostering entrepreneurship and preserving cultural heritage, the project created sustainable economic opportunities for women and enhanced the well-being of their families and broader community.

Ukraine: Future for Ukraine Charity Foundation

The “**GIDNA**” project by the Future for Ukraine Charity Foundation provided free psychological assistance to women who had experienced or witnessed sexual violence during the war. The support provided ensured that affected women received professional therapy from trained psychologists and that these specialists benefited from regular supervision by experts through the delivery of high-quality, trauma-informed care. Through this partnership, this project helped restore dignity, mental health, and hope to survivors while strengthening Ukraine’s long-term resilience and professional psychological services.

Uruguay: Fundación Liceo Francisco Paysandú

The **Fundación Liceo Francisco** received support to implement the “Embracing Diversity: Communication and Life Skills Workshop.” This initiative aimed to empower 150 students from underserved backgrounds by equipping them with essential life tools to navigate challenges such as discrimination, violence, and lack of support at home. Through interactive modules on inclusion, conflict resolution, personal finance, and communication, the project fostered resilience, empathy, and confidence. This project helped to make it possible to create a safe, equipped space for transformative learning and long-term social development.

Uzbekistan: Mehirli Insonlar

The **“Skills for a Better Future” project** received support to provide vital vocational training to girls and women from low-income families. Led by the National Center for Social Adaptation of Children, this initiative offered hands-on instruction in sewing, cooking, and hairdressing, equipping 30 beneficiaries with the tools to achieve financial independence. The support provided ensured access to equipment, materials, and a safe training environment. By fostering practical skills and confidence, the project empowered participants to create sustainable livelihoods and contributed to long-term community development.






